

South African National Championships

- You choose the days you wish to shoot!
- * Your first 200 targets will count towards the SA Championship in that discipline.
- * Your 3rd 100 targets will be for trials only.

Mackintosh International Postal Championship

- * Your first 100 targets in the SA DTL Championship counts as the qualifying round. The top 25 seniors, 5 ladies, 5 veterans and 5 juniors must then shoot the Mackintosh Championship to determine the top 20 seniors, 4 ladies, 4 veterans and 4 juniors.
- * The actual Mackintosh Championship (also known as the "Final") is a separate 100 target competition on Sunday, 3rd May. This event is open to all participants, not just the Mackintosh qualifiers.







MACKINTOSH INTERNATIONAL POSTAL EVENT

Brief summary of rules



- DTL Trap discipline only: your first 100 targets shot in the SA Champs is your "qualifying round".
- The MACKINTOSH CHAMPIONSHIP (also known as the Mackintosh Final) is a separate event with separate medals/prizes to be held on Sunday, 3rd May, You must enter this event separately even if you are a Mackintosh qualifier.
- Top 25 Seniors from the 1st 100 targets (the qualifier) go forward to shoot 100 targets on Sunday where the top 20 scores will count
- Top 5 Ladies go forward to Sunday (top 4 scores to count)
- Top 5 Juniors go forward to Sunday (top 4 scores to count) Junior must be under the age of 21 at the date of the UK event (usually July)
- Top 5 Veterans go forward to Sunday (top 4 scores to count) Veteran must be over the age of 60 as at 16th July 2015
- Shooters may only compete in one category no doubling up allowed.
- A kill with the first barrel is scored as 3
- A kill with the second barrel is scored as 2, and a loss is zero
- Target settings to be as per DTL Trap Rules
- A score of 290 in the Mackintosh Championship will earn CTSASA Colours
- DTL Trap rules to apply throughout
- MackIntosh trophy to remain in possession of CTSASA office
- Must shoot second barrel if first shot misses (in actual MACKINTOSH event!).

Competition Regulations



- 1. Competition will start promptly at the specified times. The first squad must be on the ranges and ready to shoot 15 minutes before the allotted time. Succeeding squads to be on the range 10 minutes before preceding squad have completed their round. Any shooter absent when his/her squad is due to shoot will forfeit the complete round of targets. An appeal to the appropriate jury may be made to consider the reason for the absence. An appeal fee of R250 must be paid with the appeal and the appeal must be in writing. People shooting multiple disciplines that overlap will be excused from this rule.
- Scoring: There will be umpires supplied but if the range does not have one, the following rules apply:

Trench & Skeet: Two shooters from the previous squad to score for the next. Visible scoreboard on Trench to be used.

Trap: One shooter from previous squad to score for the next.

All shooters must sign for their scores before leaving the range. All shooters in all disciplines must check their score before leaving the range and at appropriate times during the round. Any dispute regarding scores cannot be reported to the jury unless a protest is made according to the discipline ruled and before leaving the range.

- 3. Umpires will be provided where possible on all ranges. Competitors will be required to score and will score in rotation, i.e., the first 2 shooters on a squad will score first, followed by shooters 3 and 4, followed by shooters 5 and/or 5 and 1 where applicable. Scorers for the first squad of the day will be taken from the last squad. Refusing to score is not permitted. Any shooter refusing to score will be penalized with the loss of 3 targets per refusal.
- 4. The 10 second 'ready' rule FITASC Universal Trench will be strictly applied.
- Rules: CTSASA By-laws, ATA, FITASC and NSSA Skeet. At all times, where there is a CTSASA over-riding bye-law, this will take precedence over the individual discipline rules.
- Shooters may not change squads and shooters may not alter the squad shooting sequence.
- All score pads must be signed by each individual in the squad, the scorers and the umpire. Only justifiable queries to be referred to the Jury via the Convenor. Pads to be returned to the office by the scorer at the end of the round.
- Equipment: traps, scramblers etc., must not be tampered with. In the event of a breakdown contact the shoot convenor.
- Please assist the organizers by adhering to these rules and so facilitate the smooth running of this event.
- 10. Where a dispute occurs and the rules are not explicit enough to provide a clear cut decision, the final decision rests with the individual discipline jury as elected for this event.





CTSASA MERIT COLOURS

CTSASA Merit Colours are awarded to/for:

Ordinary Senior Members Junior Members Umpires National Team Members Special Awards



There are several ways in which members may earn the prestigious CTSASA Merit Colours:

- Seniors (ladies/men): accumulate three 'legs' by shooting specified percentages at South African National Championships in specified disciplines.
- Achieve a place in a National South African Team by qualifying in the National Trial system.
- 3. Shoot 290 ex 300 in the Mackintosh International Postal Championship Final.
- 4. Juniors only: accumulate 2 'legs' in any two South African National Championship by shooting specified percentages in specified disciplines.
- 5. Juniors only: shoot a specified percentage in an international championship held in South Africa.

Accumulated 'legs' do not have to be in any specific time frame - they can be accumulated over any number of years.

The CTSASA Dress Code

For all South African Grand competitions, all competitors are required to adhere to the dress code as per the CTSASA regulations (article 8.5 - see below).

In addition, the dress code for prize-giving/opening ceremony to follow that of the CTSASA dress code regulations.

It is expected that all visitors are also required to dress appropriately for this prestigious event.

Dress Standards (as per the CTSASA Competition Regulations)

At all CTSASA events described above, participants' dress will be expected to be in a tidy and clean condition and should not contain any messages or slogans that may reasonably cause offence to others. Offensive messages of a sexual or racial nature are specifically forbidden as well as any that break accepted standards of decency and good taste. The byword for the standard to be achieved will be "smart/casual".

Examples of appearance or garments considered unacceptable under this Code:-

- Nakedness of the trunk or limbs other than lower arms or legs
- Wearing of shooting vests over naked flesh
- Sleeveless shirts or tops (other than shooting vests)
- · Cut-off jeans or trousers, or any type of shorts other than tailored shorts
- Torn, slashed or shredded shirts, jeans, trousers or skirts
- · Military or camouflaged wear of any type
- · Any excessively worn, dirty or derelict clothing or footwear
- Any other garments or personal appearances that go against the spirit of this Code or that seek to exploit any possible loophole within it, at the discretion of the persons named in clause 8.5.2, above.
- Bermuda type shorts, which have the bottom of the leg more than 15cm above the center of the kneecap, are not allowed.


Eye & Ear Protection

Eye and ear protection is mandatory for all shooters at all CTSASA events. Eye protection is the wearing of spectacles (glasses). Ear protection is either plugs or ear muffs.
